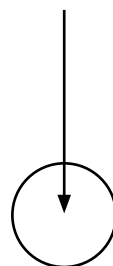

OUR VISION & STORY

MISSION - César Chávez Dual Spanish Immersion (CCDSI) empowers all students to become bilingual and bi-literate students who embrace learning to achieve their personal best and become mindful citizens who succeed in life. We provide tools and strategies to promote growth across all learning domains and build students' social and emotional capabilities.

VISION - César Chávez Dual Spanish Immersion School seeks to create a challenging environment that encourages high expectations for success through the Dual Spanish Immersion model. We recognize that each child is an individual; all children have gifts, all children need to succeed, and our families are partners in education. Our school promotes a safe, developmentally appropriate, caring, and nurturing environment.

SCHOOL HISTORY - César Chávez Dual Spanish Immersion (CCDSI) is a magnet school in Hyattsville, MD, part of the Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) system. CCDSI aims to help students develop fluency in Spanish, gain a deeper appreciation for different cultures, and achieve academic excellence.

CCDSI existed initially as a community elementary school called Parkway Elementary. The dual Spanish immersion program at CCDSI began in the 2015 school year, starting with Kindergarten and expanding one grade each year.

In late 2024, [CCDSI received significant recognition](#), being designated as an "International Spanish Academy." This places CCDSI school among the best Spanish immersion programs in North America.

Today, CCDSI operates on a 50/50 Two-Way Spanish Immersion model, meaning that students learn in both English and Spanish for roughly equal amounts of time. CCDSI has evolved into a highly-regarded institution for bilingual education in Prince George's County.

Stay Connected

One of the most important steps for a successful school year is clear and consistent communication. School Uniforms

The [school uniform](#) is light blue shirt or navy blue shirt with navy blue bottoms and sports shoes (no open toe or open back shoes allowed for safety). Students are expected to be in **full uniform** every day. The exception is **Wildcat Wednesdays**, when students have the option to wear purple or Wildcat spirit wear to show school pride.

First Day of school is Tuesday, August 26, 2026. Our school hours are **8:30 a.m. to 2:45 p.m.** daily.

- **Breakfast** is served in the classroom at **8:15 a.m.**
- Please note: **students should not arrive before 8:15 a.m.** as there is no adult supervision prior to that time. Student safety is our top priority.
- **Dismissal:** Buses depart between 2:45 and 3:00 p.m.

Lunch Applications – Due September 2026 (Date to be announced)

All families must **submit a new lunch application** this year, even if you’ve qualified in the past. If not submitted and approved by **September 2026**, students will be charged the **full lunch price of \$2.75**.

Pride Dance Performances

December & June

"Pride Dance" is a dance club for K-5 students led by Ms. Nelson. The club invites, parents, students, teachers and community for grand performances in December featuring a Christmas theme and May celebrating the students' growth and joy as dancers.

Kindergarten Promotion

June

An end-of-year celebration marking students' transition from kindergarten to first grade. While specific daily schedules vary by year, the milestone event typically features student performances in both English and Spanish, certificates of completion, and family celebrations coordinated with the school community

5th Grade Promotion

June

The event marks the transition of elementary students completing their dual-language primary education. Events typically feature bilingual student presentations, certificate distributions, and milestone celebrations honoring achievements in the magnet program.

ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

Morning Drop-off

◆ Please have your child ready to exit the vehicle when you reach the drop-off zone.

◆ Students should only exit the car when they reach the drop-off zone. Please keep your child in the car until they reach the cones and the vehicle comes to a complete stop. Avoid having your child exit by the gated area.

◆ In order to maintain the flow of traffic, please drive all the way down the drop-off zone or where directed by staff members.

◆ If your child requires assistance opening doors, you may exit the vehicle to do so for them. Please be mindful of traffic flow.

◆ If you arrive before morning drop-off time (8:15am), please remain in your vehicle until staff members arrive at the drop-off area.

◆ Please be mindful of other children crossing from parking lots and vehicles that are backing up.

◆ If possible, have your child exit from the passenger side of the vehicle in the drop-off zone.

◆ If your child needs extra assistance at drop-off, please park in the designated areas.

◆ **PLEASE DRIVE SLOWLY!**



Dismissal

◆ Dismissal starts at 2:45pm

◆ Bus riders are escorted to their bus by staff as buses arrive. Bus rider vests are required.

◆ Walkers are dismissed at the back gate as parents/guardians arrive.

◆ Car riders are dismissed to the back or side depending on where you are in line. Car rider number required.

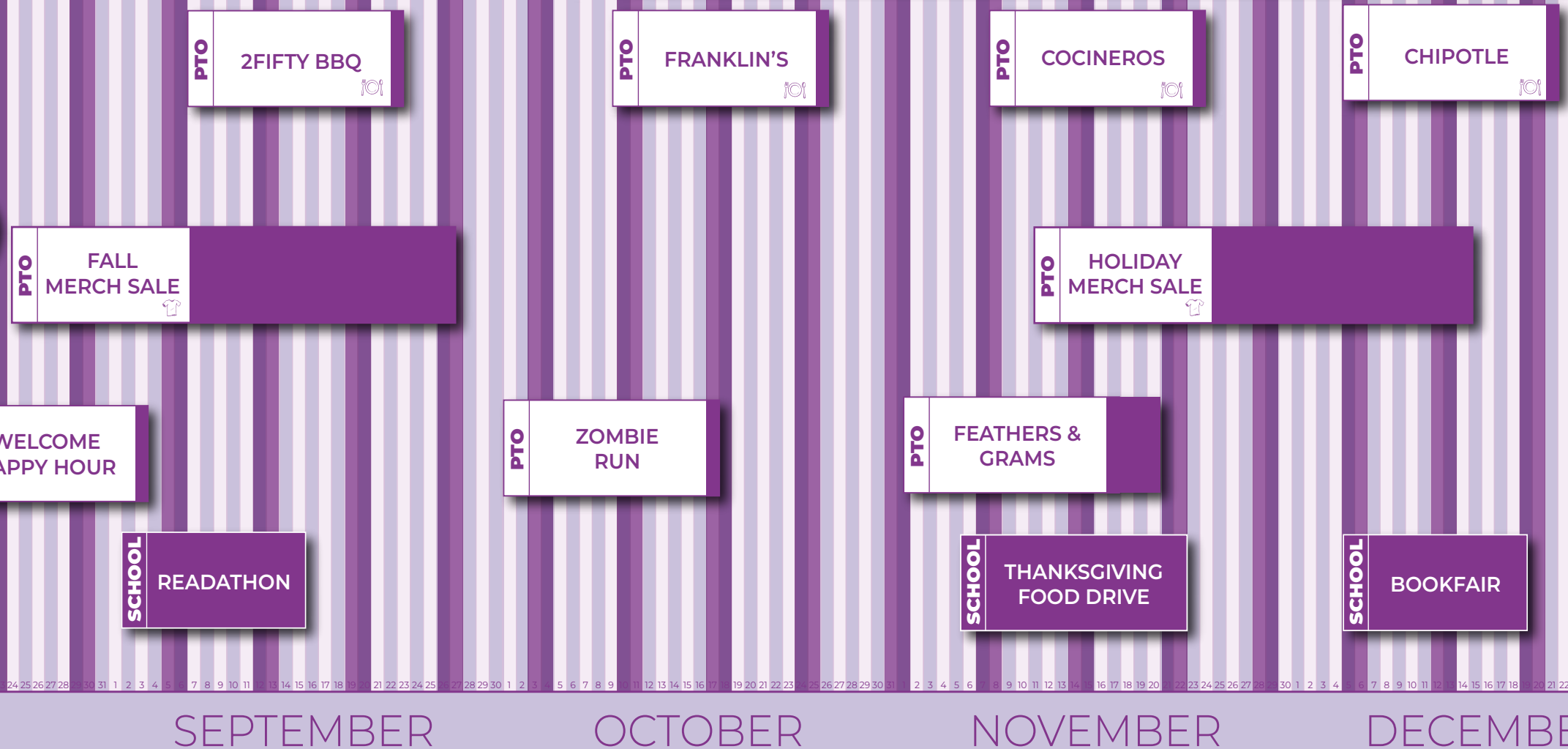
THE GIVING GROOVE

Let's get real for a minute...

Whether this is your first experience with elementary school or you're a seasoned veteran, we all learn pretty quickly that parent contributions fall into two buckets: time and money. And the asks for both can feel constant.

SURVIVING LANGUAGE IMMERSION

Make learning a new language part of your daily life

Watch & Listen

- Listen to music in the target language
- Watch educational TV shows in the target language (PBS en español, Binocs)
- Listen to kids podcasts or audiobooks in the target language

Read

- Read books in the target language or bilingual books. The Library at Cesar Chavez is there to help.
- Use Google Translate or another translation app to help with vocabulary
- Consider a subscription to a kids' magazine like Highlights Bilingue
- Get a Spanish/ English dictionary for the student to keep with them in their backpack

Practice

- Review homework together
- Sign up for a language learning app like: **Preply** (to practice conversations in the target language) or **Duolingo** (good for acquiring basic knowledge like simple vocabulary and conversations in the target language)
- Post vocabulary cards in the target language around your home to help the kids learn vocabulary for frequently used items.

Relax

Try not to worry too much! The teachers at Chavez are phenomenal and are experts at language immersion.
